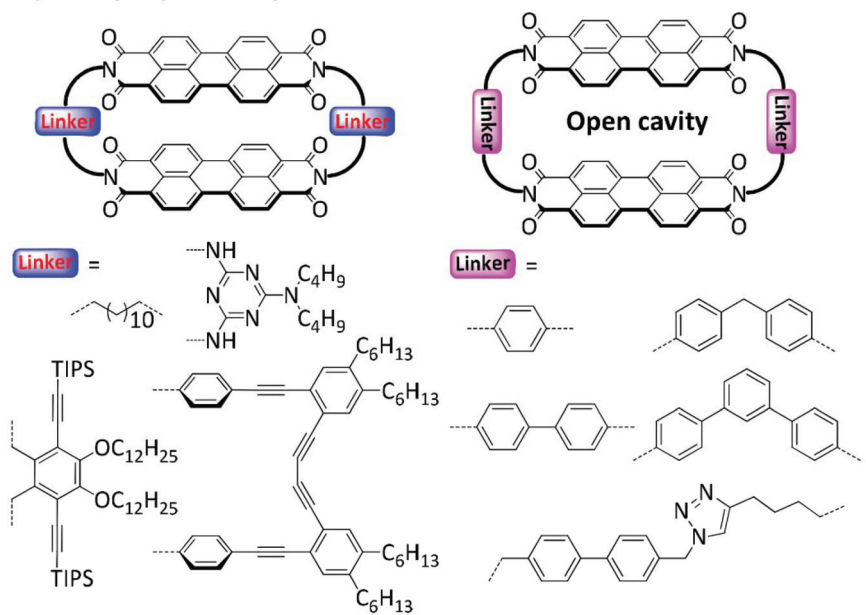
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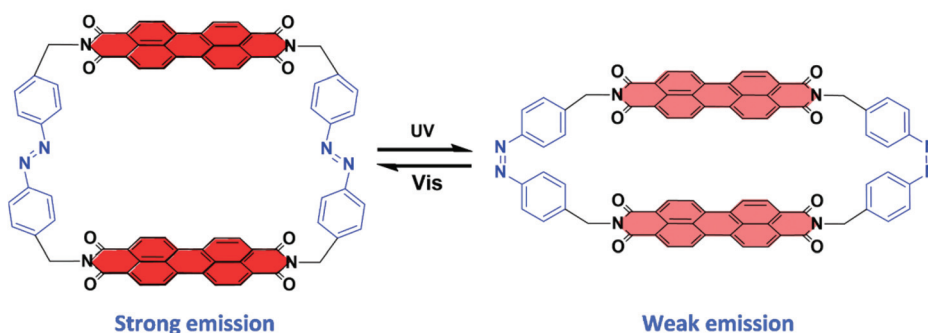
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## a) PBI Cyclophane Supramolecular Elements

Notes: The bay-position substituents of the PBIs are omitted for clarity.
