Development of fluorogenic substrates for colorectal tumor-related neuropeptidases for activity-based diagnosis

A fluorogenic substrate probe was developed to detect the activity of the colorectal tumor-related peptidase, neurolysin. This probe was used to monitor activity alterations in colorectal tumor tissues and blood samples obtained from patients with colorectal tumor. The study suggests that single-molecule neurolysin activity analysis has the potential to be a promising blood biomarker for the activity-based diagnosis of colorectal tumor.
